



MINI-GOLF *Cheat Sheet*

ROSTERS

- A full co-ed team consists of 2 players, with a minimum of 1 female. In the Open divisions, there are no gender restrictions.
- In any game, a team can play with 1 player (male or female).
- If a member of a team is absent, a sub may be recruited to play.

GAME PLAY

- Teams will play two opponents per night. Each round will be 18 holes with a round time cap of 45 minutes.
- After each game/round, captains must submit the game scores directly to the EC or the score sheet.
- If the EC is required to call 'time' on a match, finish the current hole. The score will stand as-is.
- The objective of the game is to have the lowest combined total score between partners. Achieving par is considered 72.
- Each player will have their own putter and ball. Ensure that no player in the same group has the same coloured ball.
- Teams should flip a coin on the first hole to determine which team putts first. In each consecutive hole, players will putt in the order of the player who had the lowest score on the previous hole. If players tie their score on a hole, the player who sunk their ball first will putt first.
- At the start of the hole, players must place their ball on the designated tee box. Failing to do so is considered unsportsmanlike.
- On each hole, and on the score card, there will a suggested number of strokes required to sink the ball. Sinking the ball in the required number of strokes is considered par.
- After the first putt, the player with their ball farthest from the hole will take the next shot. Teams will follow this putting order until each player has sunk their ball into the hole. Each putt of the ball is considered a stroke.
- The maximum number of strokes on each hole will be 9. If a player has not sunk the ball after 9 strokes they will pick up the ball and move onto the next hole.
- If a player's ball is obstructing a player from putting, a player will mark the spot where their ball was using a piece of paper. After the player putts, they will return their ball to the original position.

PENALTIES AND VIOLATIONS

- When putting the ball, if a ball leaves the playing area a player will return their ball to the location where the ball exited the hole. When placing the ball, a player will place their ball one putter head in distance from the sideline of the hole.
- Players are to call their own violations.
